GENERAL JAS. SPEED, who died yesterday, was the last surviving member of President Lincoln's cabinet.

DURING the past winter, which was an unusually severe one at sea, the fish commission succeeded in hatching thirty-five million cod eggs, bringing the young up by hand, so to speak, to the age of self-feeding adolescence, and turning them loose into the ocean. This crop will be "ripe" four or five years hence. The fish commission will also attempt to re-people Atlantic waters with halibut, the supply of this valuable food-fish having been depleted in waters where it was once common. The attempt will probably be made to plant the halibut in Chesapeake bay. On this north-west Pacific coast, which is alive with valuable food-fish, an attempt will be made to classify species and secure authentic statistics regarding what is as yet an only partially developed industry.

#### "Pygmalion and Galatea."

A brilliant dramatic season was inaugurated at the Victoria last evening by Mlle. Rhea, supported by Mr. Arthur Forrest and a splendid company of artists. Gilbert's mythological comedy, "Pygmalion and Galatea," was presented in a manner well calculated to arouse the admiration of our theatre-goers. Rhea's conception and portrayal of the character of Galatea showed the true artist. Her transition from the chiselled beauty of a lifeless statue to moving, living, breathing flesh and blood, a woman in full bloom of her womanhood, was indeed a marvellous piece of acting. Again, when it flashed upon her as yet, untrained mind, that Pygmalion did not love her as she loved him, the wild despairing, yet resigned look and action, betokened the true and innocent woman. Mlle. Rhea is an artist as well as our city has not seen before. Fairly dividing the honors of the performance with Mlle. Rhea, Miss Ida Waterman, as Cynisca, Pygmalion's wife, portrayed this character perfectly. Her tender, yet almost jealous, leave taking of Pygmalion contrasted strongly with her wild, jealous rage, when, on her return, she found him to be faithless. Her acting in this scene was superb, and in pronouncing the curse, which was to deprive Pygmalion of his sight, she was indeed the very embodiment of a woman consumed with jealous fires. Mr. Arthur Forrest, as Pygmalion, presented the character to the entire satisfaction of the audience—Victoria Colonist.

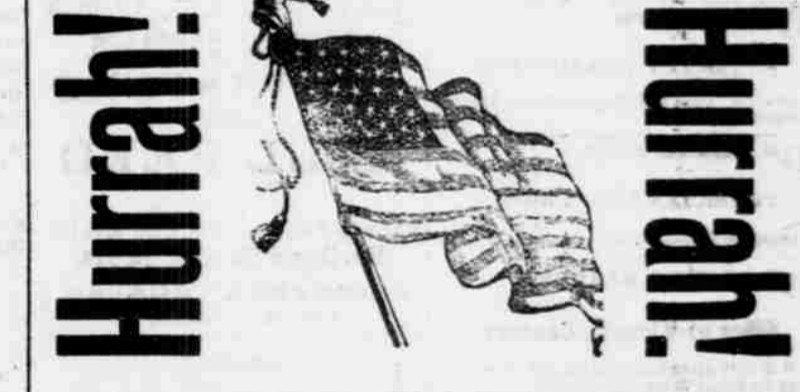
