The importance of a large meeting, and a clear and forcible expression of the need and value to the different sections of the work to be done cannot be overestimated; and it is earnestly hoped that the numerous and enterprising cities of the In-land Empire will one and all seize this opportunity of conferring together as to how the work they need so much can best be pushed to completion. As fast as delegates are appointed, their names should be sent in to the seretary of the Waterway convention, whose address is at Vancouver, W. T.
