THE CLOSE SEASON.

[Portland Journal of Commerce, July 30.] From 6 o'clock this evening un til the first day of October, it is unlawful for any salmon to be taken or fished for on the Columbia river and its tributaries. The penalty for so doing is a fine of not less than \$500, increasing with each offense, and to which may be added a year's imprisonment at the discretion of the court. Furthermore, a similar penalty can be inflicted upon anyone buying the fish so caught. Heretofore the law, which is wisely calculated to allow the fish a proper opportunity for passing up the river to deposit their spawn, has been shamefully discognized and there can fully disregarded; and there can be hardly any doubt that the practice of thus fishing out of season has largely contributed to bring the industry to its present irregular condition. Apart from the disgrace attaching to the open violation of any law, it is generally acknowledged by most reputable cannerymen that the laws regulating our salmon fisheries are good, and that their strict enforcement would do as much as anything else can do to protect and nourish the industry. In conversation with several of the cannerymen it has transpired that the only excuse they have to offer for defying the law as heretofore, is that even if they stopped fishing out of season, other packers would continue the illegal practice, and that as long FULL VARIETY AND BEST QUALITY as others fish they must do so. They must do nothing of the sort! As honest men it is each one's duty to observe the law for himself, and to inform the proper of-ficials of any breach of it that may come under his notice. Fortunately there are now fishery comsee that the law is rigidly enforced; Roadway Market. and we have received a direct assurance from governor Pennoyer that this will be done. There is every reason to hope, therefore, that the close season will be carefully guarded this time. Any one fishing after to-night will do so at his peril, and can hardly hope to escape the activity of the commismissioners and the punishment that must of necessity be inflicted

for the wrong-doing. The complaint is also made by ome cannerymen that even if fishing is stopped on the Oregon side, it will still go on in Washington territory, thereby again placing the Oregon packers at a disadvantage. Again we urge that the disadvantage is purely im aginary. What if the Washing ton canneries should, dishonestly or otherwise, pack more fish? It simply increases their pack. does not reduce the number of cases already put up in Oregon. But aside from all this there is no reason at all why the canneries on the Washington side should condo those in Oregon; and the Oregon men will only have themselves to blame it they do. The laws of Washington territory on this sub-ject are almost identical with those of Oregon. The territorial act of November 14, 1879, regulating salmon fisheries on the Co lumbia, is still, we believe, on the statute books. Its provisions are just as clear, and its penalties as heavy, as those of the Oregon law. Any person has the right to lodge a complaint of any known violation of the law's provisions; and the county officers of the territory are bound under heavy penalties to prosecute the lawbreaker. Clearly, the Oregon fishermen who are now obliged to stop work, have it within their power to en force the close season most com pletely. There has been some talk of the need of a Federal law to protect the industry. This is quite unnecessary if the Oregon fishery commissioners are true to their trust, and the Oregon cannerymen are alive to their own in




