NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT the assessment made by ordinance No. 985, of the city of Astoria, Clatsop county, Oregon, entitled an ordinance declaring the probable cost of improving Cushing's Court street from West 8th to West 9th street, which passed the common council of said city on the 26th day of July, 1887, and was approved by the mayor of said city on the 1st day of August, 1887, for the improvement of Cushing's Court street in said city, as laid out and re-ordered by J. M.
