TILLAMOOK NOTES.

GARIBALDI, Sept. 6th. Kinney has his cannery in operation on the Nehalem river, and is putting up fish, but not many.

We had some rain here three or four days ago, but not enough to bring any quantity of fish. Everybody seems to think that if we could have about three days of heavy rain salmon would come more plentiful.

The fishermen on Nehalem struck for the same as Tillamook bay fishermen were receiving and got it. They were receiving the same prices as here less transportation from Nehalem to the canneries here, which was nine cents per fish.

Salmon are running pretty slack yet. Some nights Elmore's boats average fifteen to eighteen fish and some nights the average drops to eight or ten fish.
