First Governor of Illinois. Patrick Henry was the first governor of Illinois. In 1778 Virginia created the county of Illinois (in Virginia), which embraced the territory now forming the states of Ohio, Indiana, Illinois, Michigan and Wisconsin, making probably the largest county ever organized, exceeding the whole of Great Britain and Ireland; and thus the great orator of the Revolution, then governor of Virginia, became governor of Illinois.

Some defect in the fuse was presumably the cause. The wonder is that it did not kill him outright.
