Our friends and neighbors on the north side of the river have good reason for believing that Washington territory will be admitted to the dignity of statehood this next winter. The newspapers are discussing the name to be given the territory, and all sorts of names, wise and otherwise, are proposed for the thirty-ninth in the indestructible union of indissoluble states. What's the matter with the name of Washington? Keep it; preserve it; perpetuate it; and thank God that you have such a grand name to rightly give so grand a commonwealth.

A MEETING of delegates of salt producers and merchants throughout the country was held at Pittsburgh September 16, having in view the formation of a "national salt union" through which all sales will be made. An office "will probably be located in Pittsburgh, and the entire country will be laid out in territories, each having its own salesman." By the terms of the contract, it is said, no sales can be made outside of this union, and at each quarter each firm will receive dividends according to the amount of sales made and in proportion to the amount produced. "The object of such a pool is to keep up the price of salt and to be able to compete with the foreign manufacturers." The company "will be composed of sixty-three firms in all, eleven in Pittsburgh, nine in New York, thirty in Michigan and thirteen in Ohio."

THERE is one free railroad in the world within the limits of a city. When Oakland, Cal., gave the Central Pacific railroad company the right of way through its streets, the grant was made on the express condition that fare should not be charged within the city limits. The company has always acted up to this condition, even to the extent of admitting additions made to Oakland within the privilege. "People for five or six miles get on and off the cars and ride without money and without price. Oakland, which is one of the handsomest cities in California, is increasing very rapidly in population. The railroad company finds that it is carrying an enormous number of passengers for nothing, and is looking for relief under the circumstances. Yet the people insist upon the bargain, and it is difficult to see how it can be broken without their consent."

THE postoffice department has decided that permissible writing or printing on the face or surface of packages of mail matter of the fourth class, in addition to the name and address of the sender preceded by the word "from" and the number and names of the articles inclosed, may include, without subjecting them to postage at the letter rate, the occupation, trade or profession of the sender printed thereon, with his name and address, designating words not, however, to be more than necessary to give certainty to the address of the sender, as, for example, "John Doe, Banker, 100 Broadway, New York," and a simple request to return in a specified time if not delivered. The usual notice to postmasters asking to be advised of amount of postage required for return, which will be forwarded, is no longer necessary, as now all classes of mail matter are returned upon request, and postage where due collected upon delivery to the sender.
