## Sparks May Resign.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 19.—About ten days ago secretary Lamar reversed the decision of Gen. Sparks, which resulted in giving the Chicago, St. Paul, Minneapolis Omaha Railway company about 2,000,000 acres of land, which the land commissioner alleged rightfully belonged to the United States as an Indian and military reservation. The commissioner is now preparing a letter to the secretary asking him to review his recent decision. He was engaged upon that work this morning when an acquaintance entered the room.

Gen. Sparks impressively said: "Sooner or later the man who undertakes to fight corporate monopolies goes to the wall."

"Surely this is not true with you?" queried the commissioner's visitor.

Sparks replied: "No; there is too much right on my side. Monopolies can't dash my brains out, but I've abundant proof every day that they are trying it mightily hard."

Before Gen. Sparks' visitor left the room he satisfied himself from remarks made by the commissioner that in the event that secretary Lamar does not reverse his recent decision, Gen. Sparks will feel it incumbent upon himself to tender his resignation.

Regarding the report in yesterday's ASTORIAN of the defiant Halifax cruiser going to sea in Alaskan waters, the chief of the revenue marine service is reported in a Washington dispatch as saying: "We are inclined to believe that story. Of course if any vessel flying the British flag, or any other flag, is discovered seal fishing in Behring sea, it will be the duty of the *Rush* to command her to surrender. If the sealer refuses, our officers will make the capture by force, or sink her if necessary. The *Rush* carries a good battery and can make a pretty good fight."
