BOB MORROW, the San Francisco millionaire and jury fixer, has had his trial; the jury "disagreed"—eleven for conviction, one for acquittal.

THE prohibition amendment in Tennessee is said by the press of that state to owe its defeat to the Democrats, the result showing that only ten out of fifty-six Democratic counties gave majorities for it.

JOHN BRIGHT, the great English commoner, in a recent letter to a friend in Canada on the temperance question, says: "It seems that a severe system of taxation is almost the only remedy that can be adopted with much hope of success."

A Boston cigar manufacturer being prosecuted recently for selling cigars on Sunday in violation of the Sunday law, raised the novel plea that tobacco was defined in the pharmacopoeia as a remedial drug, and the sale of drugs was not prohibited on Sunday.

THE general assembly, Knights of Labor, killed the usefulness of the general executive board, for the coming year at least, in taking away the only source of revenue it had by voting that it be not compulsory on the part of assemblies to pay their assessments to maintain the board.

THE effect of a protective tariff as it applies to the workmen is shown from the fact that while the American workmen in nine states, under protective tariff, have over \$1,000,000,000 in savings banks, the vastly greater mass of workmen in England, Ireland, Scotland and Wales, all working under free trade, have only two-fifths as much in the postal and savings banks.

THE Glasgow Herald, in acknowledging the completeness and fairness of the defeat of the Thistle, advocates the construction of a center-board yacht to compete for the America cup. But whether this plan meets with approval or not, adds the Herald, we must on no account dream of giving up the friendly contest which has such a deep hold on the lovers of this noble and exhilarating sport on both sides of the Atlantic.

THE correspondence between the department of justice and its officers in Alaska, in regard to the release of British vessels seized during the summer of 1886, for alleged violation of the seal fishery laws, is made public. The first order for the release of the Canadian vessels at Sitka was sent by telegraph, and the United States marshal at Sitka did not comply with it, because he feared it was bogus.

THERE is no reason for raising a tariff wall that will be absolutely insurmountable by foreign goods.
