

Our Sister Territory.

Eugene Semple, governor of Washington territory, in his annual report to the secretary of the interior, estimates the population of the territory at 143,669, an increase of over 16,000 in the last two years. The taxable property of the territory exclusive of railroad property is given at \$50,683,-896, an increase of nearly \$2,000, 000 over last year. Settlement on public lands, of which nearly 17,-000,000 acres remain unsurveyed, has been retarded by that fact, by the uncertainty of Northern Pacific titles, by extensive Indian reservations, etc. The report speaks at length of the resources and capabilities of the territory, in the way of crops, stock-raising, minerals and lumber production, etc., and of their great variety and importance. Of 64,000 children of school age, the average daily attendance is about 22,000. Labor is hardly equal to the demand. The salmon fisheries yielded \$12,-124,000 during the year. News from the Arctic, Oct. 5,

was that no disaster had been reported this year by the whaling were out of the Northern sea at that time. Thirty-one whalers reported a catch of 256 whales, the largest number for many years.




