OUR FISHERY INTERESTS

Since the close of the salmon season on the lower Columbia river the fish commissioners have been diligently engaged at the propagating establishment on the Clackamas. The results up to date have exceeded expectations. About a million and a quarter eggs have been secured, and it is believed that the fish still remaining in pound will yield another million. An average of 90 per cent, is being hatched out, so nearly two million young salmon will be set loose in the course of the fall.

the fall. The work this year was, as a matter of necessity, largely experimental, and very much limited by lack of money. The commissioners, if not altogether new to the business of propagation, lacked duty of commending them. A self-im-posed tax of one cent per case for sup-port of the hatchery has been paid in all but a few instances, and with perfect cheerfulness. 
