Stocking Up With Fish.
United States commissioner Swan has received a communication from Thomas Mowatt, fisheries inspector of British Columbia which states that a large shipment of lobsters from Chaleur bay, Nova Scotia, is expected to arrive in British Columbia next week. The lobsters will be deposited in Burrard inlet and in Esquimalt harbor. The same car will bring 9,000,000 young salmon to be placed in the Fraser river. There will also be a lot of blue bass for the rivers, and a large amount of salmon eggs for the hatcheries. Next season inspector Mowatt expects to have a steam schooner placed at his command to investigate a reported bank of cod and halibut on the west coast of Queen Charlotte island.—*Port Townsend Call.*
