A LITTLE COMPARISON.

OREGON has just had an election wherein, to the credit of the state and of the state press be it said, decency, good temper and fair treatment characterized both sides, and courtesy was evinced throughout by those who favored and those who opposed the amendments.

In contrast to Oregon we cite New York. Our New York friends who are so fond of jibing "the roddy west," "Oregon style," etc., had a little campaign, the same as Oregon, and a little election the same day—Tuesday, the 8th inst.

It was a sort of mixed fight. In New York city, the candidate for district attorney on the Democratic ticket was a gentleman named Fellows, whose chief claims to distinction appear to be a demand on his part of money from "Big Six," William M. Tweed, and a refusal on his part of late years to pay his poker debts. Against him the Republicans, who apparently couldn't find any one in their own party good enough to run, ran another Democrat named Nicoll, who appeared to be angry because his own party passed him over to give Fellows the nomination and so accepted the candidacy from the Republicans. Fellows beat Nicoll. However, that is neither here nor there.

What we want to compare is this. The stately and saintly New York Times, Tribune, World, Mail and Express, and Post, supported Nicoll. The Sun, Herald, Star, Telegram and News supported Fellows.

Now, to New York, the center and seat of refinement, the place where all those big papers are published that so sarcastically exorcise "Oregon style," we have a right to look for a gentlemanly conducted political campaign on their part.

But what do we find? Mr. Dana, of the Sun, calls Mr. Pulitzer, of the World, "Judas Pulitzer." Mr. P. elegantly retorts by calling Mr. D. "Coward Annas Dana." (Mr. D.'s initials are C. A., and Mr. P.'s front name is Joseph).

But as if this were not enough to cause journalists in "wild and woolly Oregon" to blush and hang their heads in shame over the degeneracy and degradation of their New York brethren, we regretfully make public the fact that a careful perusal of the columns of our only partially esteemed New York contemporaries, shows that the cultured and courteous editors of the newspapers we have named above, used the following terms of endearment toward each other during the heated term which, fortunately for their readers, came to an end on the 8th. We quote literally:

"Thieves Own Dorheimer;" "Caitiff Dana;" "Hungry Joe;" "Judas Iscariot;" "Liberator of private virtue;" "Vaporing blackmailer of credulity and ignorance;" "Traacherous, selfish, mercenary assassin;" "False, treacherous and venal old reprobate;" "Hissing snake of party treachery;" "Self-inflated toad of personal aggrandizement;" and so on, and so on.

Space precludes further expression of journalistic regret over these unhappy men, but while it is not for such as we to criticize exalted journalistic talent in New York, we humbly assert that the specimens given above, culled from New York metropolitan journals have never been equaled in their peculiar personality by anything we have seen on this coast.

### FRESH FASHION FANCIES.

Dark green felt hats are in favor. Plush is revived in fashionable favor. Silver, gold and steel braids appear on dressy jackets.

The short visor or mantle is the wrap for full dress.

Fancy handkerchiefs come in titled battle in the new shades of red, blue and heliotrope, with the initial or monogram crest or flower designs embroidered in the corner in white.

The handkerchief is fancifully worn, like a flower or corsage boutonnet, peeping out of the bosom, from the waistcoat or jacket pocket, or tucked into the belt or sash that girdles the waist, and its colors are flower-like, and so is its size and adjustment.

Unless the material of the dress is very thick, sleeves are frequently arranged in narrow pleats or tucks above the elbow, with a puffing at that point, and then made very plain and light from the wrist, where they are fastened with a row of small button-shaped buttons.

In all cases wrings fit closely to the figure at the back and are quite brilliant over the shoulders, but they may be loose in front or partially fitted to the figure. The trimming is all used in lengths of lines, never as a border at the bottom, and this has a tendency to give additional height, and it is well adapted to conceal the defects in the figure of a stout woman, when the plump beauty of youth becomes the hateful embospoint of middle age.
