So far as the mechanism of the new phonograph may be described at present, it consists of a cylinder which revolves upon itself, and also has a side movethread, so that a fixed pencil spiral with lines almost touching. The motive power used is an electrie motor devised by Edison, The phonographs will be sold in the shape of small cylinders 14 inch in diameter and from 1 inch to 4 nches in length. The 1 inch phonographs will contain 200 words or what is considered quite sufficient for an ordinary business letter. They will cost 15 cents a dozen, full size. The phonograms of four inches in length will contain from 800 to 1,000 words, according to the rate of speed of the speaker, and will cost about 36 cents per dozen.
