Lumber Enterprises.

FRESNO, Dec. 17.—The San
Joaquin Lumber company will
start the building of a gigantic
milling and lumber plant this
month. The company will erect
in the mountains three large saw
mills, capable of turning out 200,
000 feet of rough sawed lumber
per day. This will be conveyed
to a point about twenty miles from
this city by a flume seventy miles
long. Fourteen million feet of
lumber will be required to build
the flume. From the end of the
flume lumber will be brought into
the city by a dummy railroad. In
this city there will be erected a
large planing mill and sash, door
and blind factory, and all the tim-
ber sawed by the mills will be used
up in that manner here. There is
standing in the belt of timber in
the mountains where the saw mill's
will be built fully one billion two
hundred million feet of lumber,
900,000,000 of which is redwood.
Fresno county has the largest
grove of redwoods in the world, it
being 3,600 acres in extent and
the majority of the trees being
from 20 to 32 feet in diameter.
A branch flume, twenty miles long,
will be built to tap this and a belt
of sugar pine and yellow pine,
which is estimated to contain 750,
000,000 feet. Capital to the extent
of \$2,000,000 will be required
for the undertaking.

A Disastrous Explosion.

WESTCHESTER, Pa., Dec. 16.—
An explosion of a twenty-horse
power boiler of the Edison Elec-
tric company works this afternoon
caused the death of five persons
and the injury of three others.
Superintendent Walter Embree
was engaged with a force of men
close to the stack, unloading a new
boiler, and the whole party was
buried beneath falling bricks. Em-
bree and four laborers were killed,
and three badly injured. Hettie
Jones, aged 10, returning from
school, almost a square from the
scene, was instantly killed by a
flying beam. It is thought that all
the bodies have not yet been dis-
covered. A large force of men to-
night is digging over the ruins by
lantern light.

To Reduce the Surplus.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 16.—Sen-
ator Hoar, of Massachusetts has in-
troduced a bill to facilitate and
develop the resources of Alaska
and to open an overland com-
mercial route between the United
States, Asiatic Russia and Japan.
The bill directs a survey to be
made of a route for the construc-
tion of a railway by the most feasi-
ble route from the northern
boundary of the United States
through British Columbia and
Alaska to a desirable harbor on
the southern coast of the Alaskan
peninsula, on Behring sea. It is
intended to begin at or near Spa-
kanie Falls, on the Northern Pa-
cific road, and run north on the
eastern side of the Rocky moun-
tains, deflecting westwardly for a
branch line to be continued north
and west to a desirable harbor on
the Alaskan peninsula. One hun-
dred thousand dollars is appropri-
ated for the survey.
