## An African Monster Under Arrest.

King Ja-Ja, of Opobo, South Africa, has been deposed and arrested by the British authorities. He interferred with the palm oil trade on his frontier. His colored majesty's favorite occupation has for some years been the beheading of his subjects. Another of his pleasant ways of obtaining recreation was to fasten down a number of men and women to the ground with their limbs pegged out in the shape of an X. His Majesty would then sprinkle them with boiling pitch, with the assistance of an iron colander—a supply of these domestic articles being presented to the King from time to time by the British residents. When the pitch ran short boiling lead was substituted but the latter is said to have run too slowly for the royal manipulator. The British did not prevent his Majesty from enjoying himself, but when it came to question of interfering with British commerce 'twas quite another matter.—Natal Times.

## Female Suffrage in Washington Territory.

A number of petitions for female suffrage were presented in the house, and one in the council, and referred to the judiciary committee. Remonstrances against the passage of a female suffrage law have been received from Clarke county women, and more are coming from different parts of the territory. The remonstrants say, among other things: "We have heretofore felt it a disagreeable duty to vote in order to offset the votes of bold and aggressive schemes and office-seekers of our sex; that no good in politics has been accomplished by women voting; that just in proportion as woman clamors for office and wrangles in politics she loses the highest regards of the masculine mind, loses her protection and wins contempt." Mr. Knapp says every woman in his neighborhood has signed this remonstrance.
