Archison, Kansas, March 9. - A collision occurred yesterday on the Bur-lington & Missouri River railroad. He will report them in the order named, and will insist on having the tariff-reduction bill considered and disposed of, be-fore the other is taken up. There will be an implied menace in this arrangement that if the Democrats, especially the North Carolinians and the Georgians, do not join heartily in the tariff legislation they will not be allowed an opportunity to recon-struct the odious internal revenue
