

Under the headings, "A muchdreaded port," "Captains disgusted with Portland," the Oregon Siftings, discoursing about shipping sailors and the way it is done in that city, says: "It is a very clear fact that the prosperity of Portland depends

mainly on the shipping business, and it is well known that ships cannot be taken from one port to another without sailors or seamen. Therefore, why do not people study the welfare of those seamen who have to go through hardship and danger to bring the ships in and out. It is a notorious fact that Portland is one of the worst places for poor Jack to be swindled out of his well-earned wages by the crimps and sailor's boarding house masters and runners. The way all this is carried on is very simply and clearly demon-strated by the following: The wages for deep-sea seamen or long voyagers is fixed and maintained at \$30 per month, with \$40 advance or bonus note; besides this no sailor, or "hoe boy," (commonly designated so aboard ship as a useless article) is allowed aboard unless the captain pays the blood money, which varies from \$70 to as high as \$125 for each seaman. Now, if the blood money was done away with, Jack could easily obtain from \$40 to \$45 per month, as owner's or captain's pocket. It is it would not be any more out of an a well-known fact that all the sailor boarding house masters are in a ring to the furthering of robbing both Jack and the captains. Most ships go away from here very badly manned, say six or nine sailors and the rest of the crew "hoe boys' picked up by the runners of these houses; they are given their board and lodging, a few rags or old clothes, and a bed. For this the boarding-house master gets the \$100 or \$125 blood money and \$40 in advance, swindling the captain by representing the lads as sailors, and making doubly hard the working of the sails and ship on the real sailor. For a "hoe boy" is not fit for any seaman's duty until he has been a couple of voyages or so. There is another great wrong: sailors are worried and pestered by boarding-house masters until they leave their ships, on purpose to have an opening to ship men when she is ready for sea again. In several ships they have told seamen that it would be worse for them to stay by their vessel, as they would have them out of the ship when she came to Astoria again.

All the above is perfectly true and could be substantiated if the matter were looked into. A good deal of this is Jack's own fault for allowing these land sharks to fil him up with whiskey when putting him aboard; but still there are a good many who are intelligent and worthy men, who suffer with the AUG. DANIELSON, rest. Now, if those who have the charge of looking after these affairs, would do so, something might be done toward the amelioration of Jack's wrongs. This is not the only great drawback to Portland's shipping interest; there is the excessive price for towage, wharfage, stowage, etc. In fact it would be well for those interes ted in the wellfare of shipping interests to look into these matters; but the reports of British captains and seamen are not very flattering descriptions of the city of Port land and her way of doing busi Finest of Wines and Liquors ness. A report came to this office to the effect that a clothing firm in the north end of town is in the habit of lending money to sailors and taking an order on their wages Old Corner Saloon, and taking an order on their wages for four or five times the amount loaned. It seems that the same firm sold a hat for two dollars to on board of the British ship Rohilla, by falling through a hatchway. The captain was presented with a bill for twenty dollars. This looks like a raised check.


