## AN ARKANSAW JUDGE.

"Your Honor," said the city attorney, who happened to be present, "I do not think that the mayor is amenable to the law of humanity, as you term it. He had doubtless taken no cognizance of the loose board."  
"Mr. Clerk," said the judge, "enter a fine of seventy-five dollars against the city attorney for thinking that the mayor had not taken cognizance, and also an additional fine of one hundred dollars against the mayor for not taking cognizance."

"I protest against this," exclaimed the city attorney.  
"Mr. Clerk, enter a fine of fifty dollars against the city attorney for protesting. This court wishes to say that he is tired of being slapped by boards and bull-ragged by swamp lawyers. This court has been in the State of Arkansas nearly one year, and as yet has failed to see a sober day. "Why is this? asked the freckled faced sons of ham strung civilization. This court would modestly reply that it is on account of hurriedly-made whisky. The American people do not take time enough in the preparation of their liquor."

"What is the trouble, sir?"  
"Why, sah, the 'Merican folks drink the whisky fore it has time to get cool."  
Mr. Clerk, credit this man with fifty dollars for making a sensible remark. Now, sir," turning to the squatter, "you can go home. This country has no right to imprison a man who has correctly estimated the evils of a great social principle."—Arkansaw Traveler.
