Fruit Growers Convention.

At the session of the fruit growers of California, held at Santa Barbara, a resolution was adopted petitioning congress to appropriate not less than \$50,000 to be used by the department of agriculture for the purpose of sending experts to those countries where the fruit pests are known to have originated to discover if possible their natural enemies, the parasites, and introduce them into this country also that the department of agriculture be authorized to make actual experiments here in the field and if possible to overcome these injurious insects.
