SELF-PRESERVATION.
A Man Who Says It is Not the First Law of Nature.

"After all, self-preservation is the first law of nature."
"Claptrap."
"Well, isn't it?"
"It's generally the first instinct of a coward."
"Don't you admit that the feeling is implanted by nature in man to look first to his own safety in great peril?"
"Yes! I do, and it's just that blind, unreasoning feeling that he shares with the lower animals that every one pretending to be a man ought to fight down."
"But it's a feeling that can't be rooted out."
"I suppose not, out of the mass of mankind, which is but another name for a mass of selfishness."
"Don't you think you are a little hard on your fellows?"
"Your question is somewhat sarcastic, but I don't mind that. I hope I have very little fellowship with the shallow egotism which always considers self the most important thing in the universe."
These remarks were elicited by the account of the crushing to death of a dozen or so of people recently in a panic rush at a London theatre.
"It is easy to talk coolly when no peril is present; the imminence of great danger is very apt to upset such equanimity."
"It's all a matter of training. The mass of manhood are a pack of sheep, simply because no care is taken to teach them self-command in danger."
"How would you do it?"
"Through the mind of course. Teach children in school that they run more danger from a rush in a panic-stricken mob than they do usually from any supposed danger from which they are trying to escape. Have a big placard put up in every school room with the question and answer: 'What is the safest thing to do in a crowded place when you hear the cry of fire?' 'To sit perfectly still!'"
"Not a bad idea!"
"I should say not. You are perhaps hardly aware that there are very few, even of the largest churches, theatres or halls in the country which cannot be emptied in less than four minutes without the slightest hurry."
"I did not know that."
"It is a fact, notwithstanding. And most of them can be emptied in much less time. After the horrible sacrifice of life at the Brooklyn theatre, where over three hundred people burned to death, experiments were made on this very point in New York, and what do you think was the result?"
"I don't know."
"The largest house there, the Grand opera house, on Eighth avenue and Thirty-third street, was cleared of its occupants in less than two minutes and a half."
"Perhaps the people had been told to clear out as quickly as possible?"
"That's just the beauty of it. Not a word had been said in any theatre in that city. The people didn't even know the experiment was being made, and retired just in the usual manner, neither quicker or slower."
"You surprise me!"
"No doubt I do. The country was surprised when these facts were first published. But the public memory is now only good for about a week—then the most important, or touching or startling facts is quite forgotten."
