A Country Whose Prisons Are Never Crowded.

In Morocco the prison system is of charming simplicity, as in fact are all degrees of punishment. The Koran forbids the death penalty, although the Moors practice the punishment of "an eye for an eye and a tooth," and commit murder on the slightest provoca-tion. Instead, therefore, of executing a criminal, no matter how horrible his crime, he is thrown into a dungeon for perpetual im-prisonment, or until he can bribe his way out. The prisons of Morocco are either holes dug in the ground or buildings with no windows or doors, there being simply a trap at the top through which the criminal is lowered into the prison and his body hauled up after he has rotted to death. Into these prisons no one but the criminal ever goes, and as no provision is made for his support by the government, his lease of life depends simply on the number of friends he has, and his ability to withstand the horrors of his dungeon. This is, of course, not only a more religious way of executing criminals, but a cheaper way for the sultan to punish his subjects; for so prevalent is crime in Moroceo that in a short time every prison in the land would be filled to overflowing were it not for the fact that if a prisoner has no friends he will starve to death in about a week, and if he has friends he will rot to death in a few years, even if disease does not strike in and clean out the whole prison as soon as hot weather sets in .- Tan gier Corr. 




