When cold drain off the liquor and put it on the eggs. If too strong there will be a crust on top; if so, add more water. This is for two gallons of liquor. It is said that you can break hens of the habit of egg eating by giving them several feeds of old bacon, cut up in small bits.
When milk foams and froths in the churn, the probability is that the temperature is not correct; hence always use a thermometer when churning.
If you are troubled with white specks in butter, stir the cream every morning before it is churned, and the specks will not appear. So a good buttermaker says.
In the case of a cut, smoke the wound with burned red flannel on which has been placed a quantity of sugar, then tie up, after sprinkling with sulphur, and it will heal immediately.
As soon as you can spare the old lens, fatten them for market. They will not lay much for the next six months and in that time they will eat as much almost as they are worth.
