BAR PILOTAGE.

The Oregonian in its editorial leader yesterday takes positive ground regarding bar pilotage and towage. It thinks that bar pilot charges should be reduced one-half and that licensed river pilots should be done away with.

On this matter THE ASTORIAN has this to say: It is believed by many that there are too many bar pilots. One thing is, however, evident, viz: that no tug company, not even the O. R. & N. Co., can afford to entirely dispense with the services of a pilot on board of a vessel going in or out.

The whole thing forms an interesting question, and one that needs thorough discussion. Whatever is done in the matter in the legislature or out of it should be done only upon mature deliberation, and with no other purpose than the general good and the mutual prosperity of the river.
