Bank Financial Items.

The date side of a coin is always the head. A Cape Cod, Mass., man, now a Bostonian, is a director in fifty-seven national banks.

The most ancient known coins are the fifth century, B. C., and are Macedonian.

During the last seven years the number of national banks has increased upward of 1,000.

A few shares of the Chemical National bank, New York city, were sold recently at \$3,500 per share.

Portland has a banking capital of \$5,375,000, with surplus and profits of nearly \$2,000,000 more.

The decrease in national bank note circulation for five years ending June 30, 1888, has exceeded, \$175,000,000.

Under his sentence, Harper, of the Fidelity National bank, Cincinnati, is not required to work. His punishment is simply confinement.

The new \$20 silver certificate, just issued by the treasury department, is a pretty note, and so finely executed it will be difficult to counterfeit.

It is reported that Charles M. Kittredge, a private banker and broker of Denver, Col., was recently robbed of \$10,000 by his confidential clerk, a youth of only nineteen years.

The legal rate of interest in England is 5 per cent., but the law formerly in force against usury has been repealed and any rate of interest stipulated in a contract will be enforced by the courts.
