PITTSBURG, Pa., Sept. 1.—Rev. Father Shuck, pastor of St. Mary's church at Millhausenn, Ind., who was in the city to-day, has just returned from Rome where he had audience with the pope.

He says in an interview: "I have positive information that the pope will not remain in Rome more than two years more, and I expect he will have to leave here in the next few months. He will go to Spain where he is invited, and is sure of a cordial reception. The headquarters of the Catholic church will then be located at Madrid. Even now preparations are being made for his departure, that is liable to take place at any moment."
