AMERICAN canned foods are cheaper than imported canned food of the same kind, and are just as good in quality. This discovery of keeping foods, which is due to a French chemist in 1807, really belongs to the vegetable and fruit seasons throughout the whole year and gives distant climes an exchange of foods. Europeans can compete with Americans in this industry only in the canning of delicacies. The canning process is now used in preserving about all the desirable animal and vegetable foods. One singular fact is that canned goods are in some cases cheaper than they are when bought fresh in the market; the reason being that the canning is done when the foods are the cheapest, and that there are no wastes. The first canning was done for meat for sailors, but the industry was of little account till tomatoes and oysters were canned in this country for local trade about 1865. The business expanded in the California gold excitement and grew to immense proportions during the civil war. At this time milk was canned, and so was meat and fruits and vegetables. After the war lobster and salmon were canned, and still later the canning of corned beef grew to immense proportions, largely to supply foreign governments with a reserve of food to be used in case of war. It is nothing but newspaper sensationalism that has led people into believing that canned foods are dangerous to health. The tin plate is not acted upon by any ordinary acids or gasses of decomposition. The only poisoning that has been caused by these foods is due to the ignorance of the consumers. They open a can, let the contents begin the process of fermentation or putrefaction, by which the ptomaine poisons are developed, and these are of deadly character. These foods are perfectly safe in the hands of a person of ordinary care and intelligence.

FAIR AND UNFAIR COMPARISONS. The Tacoma Ledger of the 4th inst., to hand last evening, gives some statistics about the weather on the Sound, which are reliable.

But it unfairly goes on to say that in response to a demand by visitors of a comparison of the climate of Puget Sound and the Columbia river regions, it gives a table wherein the climate of Tacoma and of Portland is compared. While The Astorian has no objection to the Ledger making any comparison between Tacoma and Portland that it sees fit, this journal strongly objects to the daily temperature of Portland being taken as indicative or an exponent of the climate of the Columbia river regions. Here is the mean temperature at Tacoma, and at Astoria for August, taken from the official reports of the signal service in both cities.

The Arctic Whaling Fleet Wrecked. The Torpedo Charts to be Rearranged.

Special to THE ASTORIAN. ST. JOSEPH, Mo., Sept. 6.—On the Kansas City, St. Joseph & Council Bluffs road yesterday, two freight trains collided six miles from this city. Both were running at a high rate of speed. Both crews jumped. Each train was loaded with merchandise and nearly the entire cargo lost; damage, \$100,000.

THE CREWS WERE SAVED. SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 6.—The United States revenue cutter Bear, Capt. Healy, arrived from Behring sea this morning. She brings information that on August 3d the whole whaling fleet was anchored between Cape Smythe and point Barrow. A furious storm occurred and the following vessels were wrecked: The bark Mary and Susan, Young, Phoenix, Fleeting, and the schooner Jane Gray and Ina. The crews of the lost vessels, 100 in number, were rescued by the Bear and brought to this city.

MASSACHUSETTS REPUBLICANS. ST. PAUL, Sept. 6.—The platform submitted to the Republican state convention, this morning endorses the national ticket, points with pride to the results achieved under the state high license law, declares uncompromisingly in favor of American protection, but adheres to the repeated declaration of state and national platforms in favor of modification, readjustment and reduction of the tariff; reiterates the views of the Republican presidents Garfield and Arthur upon the same subject, as well as the recommendation of the commission appointed under the last Republican administration; declares these reductions should be made with care not to injure existing treaties by putting on the free list articles of prime necessity which enter into ordinary consumption of the people; favors civil service; demands the enforcement of the interstate commerce law; denounces the attempt of the Democrats to force the senate into ratification of the fisheries treaty; denounces Cleveland's foreign policy as vacillating; declares delay in the admission of Dakota selfish and dishonest; favors liberal treatment of the war veterans; declares hostility to trusts; recommends the Australian system of voting; demands the revision of the immigration and naturalization laws and stricter enforcement of the contract labor law; welcomes those disfranchised in the south on account of race to homes in Minnesota, and sympathizes with the Irish home rule movement.

THE TORPEDO SCARE. WASHINGTON, Sept. 6.—Inquiry into the report that the English army officer had secured the complete plans of our coast defenses and copies of our submerged torpedo charts, has brought out the statement that the young officer came here for that purpose but left disgusted, being unable to learn anything. Nevertheless, in view of this and our strained relations with Canada, it is said our torpedo charts will at once be overhauled and rearranged.

DEATH OF LESTER WALLACK.

The N. P. Express Robbers Arraigned. From the Leading European Capitals.

STAMFORD, Conn., Sept. 6.—Lester Wallack, the theatrical manager, died this morning. Yesterday he was working and, without the slightest warning, was stricken with apoplexy and remained unconscious till he died. During the day Wallack was seized with eighteen or twenty convulsions, some very severe. The doctors were amazed at the manner in which he pulled through them all, and said that nothing but his iron constitution kept him alive. Telegrams of condolence are pouring in from all parts of the country.

THE ROBBERIES ARRaigned. PORTLAND, Sept. 6.—Frank Anderson and Ben King, the express robbers, were arraigned to-day. Their case was the \$10,000 robbery from the Northern Pacific Express company last July. Anderson looked very thoughtful, the expression of his face indicating great mental anxiety. King feels hopeful. Anderson pleaded guilty. King, however, did not plead at that time and asked till Saturday to make up his mind what to do, which was granted. "He has an idea," so a lawyer says, "there is a possibility of escaping on a flimsy technicality."

EMPEROR WILLIAM AND HIS MOTHER. BERLIN, Sept. 6.—During the lifetime of emperor Frederick the present emperor was undoubtedly on bad terms with his parents, but since his accession to the throne his demeanor toward his mother, both in public and private, has been all that could be asked. The question is whether emperor William has sufficient force of character and conviction to resist the baneful pressure of the war party and anti-liberal sections, and adopt entirely the liberal policy his father intended to pursue. Various changes in the German army and the appointment of Herr Von Bismarck are undoubtedly part of the government programme, which emperor Frederick intended carrying out. The retirement of General Von Moltke is an event of peculiar personal, political and military interest, affecting as it does the affairs of Europe by reminding the friends and enemies of Germany that of the three great men who made the empire the statesman alone now remains in power.

GETTING MAD. LONDON, Sept. 6.—The Standard, in a savage leader on the fisheries question, says: It will be well for the president and government of the United States to remember that Canada is a dependency of Great Britain, and that if the necessity should unfortunately arise she has behind her the guns of English ironclads. If our American cousins fail to understand this allusion; if in deference to the tone of coarse brutality, which seems to be a distinguishing feature of their domestic politics, they invite us to reply to their insults in a strain they will comprehend, perhaps we may be allowed to remind them of the Treaty of Amity. The Standard further says: If we have to deal with a nation of filibusters let us at least know it. We will tell our American cousins frankly that we have not advanced so far toward ideal Christianity that we are prepared to turn our cheek to the transatlantic smiter.
