DELAY OF THE RELIEF EXPEDITION. BERLIN, Oct. 8.—The relief expedition to search for Emin Bey will not start on their mission until the uprising of natives in east Africa has been quelled.

ANARCHIST PLOT. LONDON, Oct. 8.—The south German papers report that the German police have been warned of an anarchist plot against emperor William, and that the plans for his journey have been altered in consequence.
