ELECTION NEWS.

SO FAR AS HEARD FROM. Returns up to Three This Morning.

Indications Favor Harrison's Election. Tremendous Vote Polled in New York.

New York, Nov. 6.—From Democratic sources Kings county is safe for 22,000 for Cleveland. The indications are that Richmond county is for Cleveland by 2,500, a gain of 500 over '84.

INDIANAPOLIS, Nov. 6.—There is great enthusiasm at Republican headquarters. The Republicans claim the state by 10,000. Democratic managers are equally positive that the state is safe for Cleveland.

NEW YORK, Nov. 6.—The city press association says Grant's election is assured by 20,000 to 25,000. A Tribune bulletin says Suffolk county, Long Island, gives Harrison 700 majority. Republican gain of 1,253.

NEW YORK, Nov. 6.—Two hundred and seventy-three election districts in this city give Harrison 30,387, Cleveland 46,576.

LATER.—Four hundred and seven districts give Harrison 46,333, Cleveland 71,412.

FURTHER ELECTION FIGURES. Twenty-eight election districts in New York city and Kings county give Cleveland 8,917, Harrison 5,754, Fisk 244.

NEW YORK, Nov. 6.—Thirty-eight election districts in New York state, outside of New York and Kings counties, give Cleveland 2,351, Harrison 7,765.

BROOKLYN, Nov. 6.—One hundred districts out of 375 election districts in Brooklyn give Cleveland 21,642, Harrison 17,618, Fisk 263, Streeter 13.

BROOKLYN, Nov. 6.—One hundred and forty-one districts out of 375 in Brooklyn give Cleveland 30,752, Harrison 24,770, Fisk 372, Streeter 94.

ITHACA, N. Y., Nov. 6.—Seven election districts of the town of Ithaca (complete) give Cleveland 31 plurality, against 27 in 1884.

NEW YORK, Nov. 6.—Eighty-three districts in New York state outside of New York and Kings counties, give Cleveland 13,921, Harrison 17,333, Fisk 887. The same districts in 1884 gave Cleveland 14,185, Blaine 17,397, St. John 819.

DETROIT, Nov. 6.—Twenty districts outside of Detroit give Harrison 2,950, Cleveland 2,618, Fisk 215; a Republican gain of 96.

NEW YORK, Nov. 6.—One hundred and seventy-five districts in New State, outside of New York and Kings county, give Cleveland 30,426, Harrison 40,078, Fisk 2196.

CHICAGO, Nov. 6.—Eighty-two precincts out of 341 in Chicago give Harrison 14,406, Cleveland 16,178, Fortar 18,895, Palmer 16,704.

INDIANAPOLIS, Nov. 6.—A very heavy vote was polled in this state; returns just beginning to come in.

MILWAUKEE, Nov. 6.—Fifteen precincts outside of Milwaukee show a net Democratic gain of 41.

BROOKLYN, Nov. 6.—Three hundred and thirty districts out of 375 give Cleveland 70,492, Harrison, 59,758, Fisk 918.

DETROIT, Nov. 6.—Twenty districts outside of the city give Cleveland 2,618, Harrison 2,950, Fisk 215. Republican gain 96.

BOSTON, Nov. 6.—One hundred towns in Massachusetts give Harrison 28,285, Cleveland 19,546, Fisk 1,679.

NEW YORK, Nov. 6.—Two hundred and eighty-eight election districts in New York state, outside of New York and Kings counties, give Cleveland 49,691, Harrison 68,453.

FROM MICHIGAN. DETROIT, Nov. 6.—Fifty districts outside of Detroit gave Harrison 8,256, Cleveland 7,166, Fisk 835; Luce, Republican, 8,348; Burt, Democrat, 7,371; Cheney, prohibitionist, 768. A Democratic gain of 322.

HARTFORD, Conn., Nov. 6.—Fifty-eight towns show a net gain for Harrison of 1,484.

BOSTON, Mass., Nov. 6.—Eighty towns in Maine give Harrison 26,674, Cleveland 17,467, Fisk 945.

BROOKLYN, Nov. 6.—Three hundred and sixty out of 375 districts give Cleveland 76,528, Harrison 65,974, Fisk 975.

HILL'S MAJORITY. NEW YORK, Nov. 6.—A Sun bulletin says Hill's majority in New York city is sixty-five thousand.

REPUBLICAN GAIN IN INDIANA. A Tribune bulletin says Indiana returns indicate that Harrison has made gains in every county except one.

NEW JERSEY. NEWARK, Nov. 6.—Democrat headquarters reports Cleveland's plurality in the state of New Jersey eight thousand.

RICHMOND, Va., Nov. 6.—The city gives about 600 majority for the Democrats. The estimated votes in eight counties and cities indicate the Democrat's loss from 1,200 to 1,500.

NEW YORK, Nov. 6.—The city press association says Grant's election is assured by 20,000 to 25,000. A Tribune bulletin says Suffolk county, Long Island, gives Harrison 700 majority. Republican gain of 1,253.

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 6.—Indications are that Pennsylvania has gone for Harrison by fifty thousand majority.

DES MOINES, Iowa, Nov. 6.—Forty precincts in Iowa give Harrison 6,513, Cleveland 4,142, Fisk 120.

ALABAMA, Ga., Nov. 6.—Indications are that Cleveland's majority in this state is about 20,000. Solid Democratic congressional delegation is elected.

BOSTON, Nov. 6.—Every Republican congressman is elected except one—gain of two.

NEW YORK, Nov. 6.—A Herald bulletin says both Republicans and Democrats claim Connecticut. The Democrats claim it by 1,400, and the Republicans by 3,000.

BROOKLYN, Nov. 6.—Complete returns give Cleveland 79,736, Harrison, 68,197, Fisk 1,005.

Three hundred and fifty-six election districts in New York state outside of New York and Kings county give Cleveland 61,156, Harrison 81,886, Fisk 4,619.

St. LOUIS, Mo., Nov. 6.—Sixteen precincts of Missouri, outside of St. Louis and county of Butler, complete, give Harrison 2,356, Cleveland 2,701.

NEW YORK, Nov. 6.—The Herald's bulletin: Kings county, with but one district to hear from, gives Cleveland 12,297 majority.

Four hundred and ninety-six districts in New York state, outside of New York and Kings counties, give Cleveland 86,142, Harrison 113,285, Fisk 6,946; same districts in '84, Cleveland 82,472, Blaine 103,937, St. John, 5,644.

CINCINNATI, Nov. 6.—Two hundred and seventeen precincts, net Democratic gain 785; total vote 75,312. Democrats estimate Cleveland's majority in Kentucky at 40,000; all Democratic congressmen claimed elected but one.

CHICAGO, Nov. 6.—Fifty-nine precincts outside of Chicago, in fourteen counties, show a net Republican gain for president of 807.

St. PAUL, Nov. 6.—Twenty outside towns give Harrison 3,081, Cleveland 1,225, Fisk 260.

CINCINNATI, Nov. 6.—Three hundred and sixty Ohio precincts show a net Democratic gain of 863; total vote 82,790.

PORTLAND, Or., Nov. 6.—Sixty precincts outside of Multnomah county give Harrison 6,970, Cleveland 5,501. The same precincts in 1884 gave Blaine 5,443, Cleveland 5,070; June, 1888, Hermann 6,201, Gearin 4,885.

MILWAUKEE, Nov. 6.—Seventy-eight towns, outside of Milwaukee, show 209 Republican gain.

CHICAGO, Nov. 6.—Two hundred and fifty-six out of 341 precincts give Harrison 41,473, Cleveland 44,170, Fisk 40,921, Palmer 48,049.

NEW YORK, Nov. 6.—Five hundred and twenty districts in New York state, outside of New York and Kings county, give Cleveland 89,670, Harrison 117,446, Fisk 6,561.

St. LOUIS, Mo., Nov. 6.—Thirty-six precincts in St. Louis city, out of 152, give Harrison 7,900, Cleveland 5,420, Kimball 7,854, Francis 5,289.

NEW YORK, Nov. 6.—The press association says Cleveland's plurality, allowing for a few missing districts, will be 56,000 in the city. The Herald says Cleveland has carried Connecticut by 859.

MILWAUKEE, Nov. 2.—Twenty-four precincts in the county Milwaukee give Harrison 4,335, Cleveland 4,793. Congressman Van Schatch Republican 4,562, Smith (Labor) 5,270.

St. PAUL, Nov. 6.—Seventy-one towns and precincts, including 35 precincts of St. Paul and 15 of Minneapolis, give Harrison 10,422, Cleveland 9,408, Fisk 696.

DES MOINES, Iowa, Nov. 6.—One hundred precincts give Harrison 15,071, Cleveland, 9,771, Fisk 216.

NEW YORK, Nov. 6.—The Sun bulletin says New York has a Republican plurality in the state; but it will be small. Hill is probably elected.

OHIO, Nov. 6.—Three hundred and fifteen precincts give a net Democratic gain of 1,518; towns vote 111,600. Democratic congressmen gained in the ninth Kentucky district.

BOSTON, Nov. 6.—The Boston vote complete, Harrison 27,312, Cleveland 34,159.

PORTLAND, Nov. 6.—Ninety-six precincts outside of Multnomah county, Harrison 12,767, Cleveland 9,926. Same precincts in 1884 Blaine 10,118, Cleveland 9,052. June 1888 Hermann 11,404, Gearin 9,171.

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 6.—Sixty-six precincts out of the city, Harrison 2,497, Cleveland 2,233. Same precincts in 1884 Blaine 1,676, Cleveland 1,518.

BOSTON, Nov. 6.—Massachusetts is Republican by about 2,400.

NEW YORK, Nov. 6.—The Herald bulletin says every indication is that Indiana has gone Democratic.

NEW YORK, Nov. 6.—Seventy-seven election districts in New York state, outside of New York and Kings county, give Cleveland 130,616, Harrison 164,758, Fisk 7,967. The same districts in '84 gave Cleveland 133,267.

DETROIT, Nov. 7.—The Republican state committee claims the state by 12,000 to 15,000 plurality.

HELENA, Nov. 7.—The Democrats concede the territory to the Republicans.

NEW YORK, Nov. 7.—The Herald bulletin says Connecticut is for Cleveland by about one thousand plurality.

NEW YORK, Nov. 7.—Two districts missing, Harrison 105,525, Cleveland 162,497, Fisk 1,291, Cowdry 155.

PROVIDENCE, R. I., Nov. 7.—Completed, Harrison 21,968, Cleveland 17,496, Fisk 1,276. Republican majority 3,196.

INDIANAPOLIS, Nov. 7.—Eighty precincts in Indiana gave Harrison 8,860, Cleveland 7,791.

NEW YORK, Nov. 7.—Seven hundred and eighty-six districts in New York state outside New York and Kings county, give Cleveland 151,302, Harrison 183,744, Fisk 8,762.

INDIANAPOLIS, Nov. 7.—Eighty precincts in Indiana gave Harrison 8,860, Cleveland 7,791.

RALEIGH, Nov. 7.—Returns from a hundred and sixty-five precincts show a gain for Cleveland of 661 votes.

DETROIT, Nov. 7.—Three hundred voting districts outside Detroit give Harrison 64,981, Cleveland 55,792.

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 7.—In San Francisco at midnight several precincts, so far as counted gave Harrison 539, Cleveland 554. Republicans allege fraud in count of vote.
