BRITISH CONQUEST.

The Proceedings of Two Conventions. News of The Business, Politics, Sport And Crime of One Day.

LONDON, Nov. 20.—The Parnell commission is sitting. Attorney general Webster, counsel for the Times, complained of the difficulty experienced in bringing witnesses from county Kerry. He called the judges' attention to an article in the Kerry Sentinel, Edward Harrington's paper, which stated that the judges composing the Parnell commission are showing signs of menials now, although at the opening of the inquiry they appeared to be spotless.

Reid in behalf of Harrington, complained that no notice of a charge of this character having been given, it was absolutely impossible to make answer at present. He asked that the matter be adjourned until tomorrow. Presiding justice Hammen and the attorney general agreed to this and the matter stood over.

AN AFFAIR OF "HONOR." PARIS, Nov. 20.—A duel between Andreux and Guyot, resulting from charges made by the latter in La Coterie that the Times trial was the outcome of collusion between Numa Gilly and Andrieme, was fought this morning. Swords were used and Andreux received a slight wound in the chest.

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 20.—Keely, of motor fame was released on bail, pending the hearing of his appeal from commitment for contempt of court for not preserving the model of his machine.

BOILER INSPECTORS' CONVENTION.

PITTSBURG, Nov. 20.—The convention of boiler inspectors to form a national organization, met here this morning. Delegates from nearly every state in this country were present. The principal objects were to accept a uniform system of boiler inspection, and to prevent the employment of incompetent engineers.
