The Oregon Shrimp Beds.

San Francisco, Nov. 23 .- Thomas Hendeson, an old fisherman of Ston-ington, Conn., who is in this city, says as regards beds of shrimps and codfish on the Oregon and Washing-

ton coasts: "I am not of a particularly avari-"I am not of a particularly avaricious disposition; nevertheless I am going up to sound those shrimp beds, and if I find them as extensive as reported in the few lines devoted to the cruise of the Albatross on her return a few weeks ago, I shall go into the shrimp business. The Albatross, if you remember, reported the virtual finding of these beds. Her officers set forth that the beds are not only numerous, but that they were very extensive. They said that near Coos bay, Yaquina bay, Shoalwater bay bay, Yaquina bay, Shoalwater bay and on up toward the Straits of Fuca there were beds where shrimps existed in such quantities as had never before been known. Fish Commissioner Thompson paid the Clackamas hatchery a visit yes-terday. He reports Commissioner Reed in charge, and that everything is in fine shape. The eggs and young fish are doing remarkably well. Al-ready several hundred thousand youg fish have been turned out. The commission took charge of the hatchery on the 15th of this month. From present indications, the hatch-ery will turn out 4,500,000 fish this on. This will make 6,000,000 fish in two years, a very creditable show-ing. The season will close shortly after the end of the year. The com-missioners are trying to make ar-rangements for distributing some of the fish into other waters besides the Clackamas.
