ONE OPINION.

ASTORIA, Dec. 17, 1888.

servants. It is reported in the press that the authorities at Washington, have sent a commission out here to locate a navy yard on the Sound. An Improved Life-Boat-

Chambers' semi-collapsible lifeboat is thus described: A craft of 26 feet length, 7 feet beam and 3 feet 4 inches depth, has a displacement of 11 tons and affords accommodation to 40 people. The depth of the boat proper is 14 inches, but above that is a canvas washboard fitted with galvanized iron stanchions and rails and hinged to the gunwale of the boat. When raised to be perpendicular the wash board locks itself into position by means of stays. In the ship the boat only occupies a space of eighteen inches in depth, so that three may easily be placed the one above the other and yet not occupy a greater height than an ordinary boat. There are formed around the inside of the hull something like forty air tight compartments of over three ton one in the water to get on to such raft or to right the boat when overturned. The seats in the inside of the boat are formed into tanks for stores, provisions and distress signals.
