### THE FINAL FIGURES.

Tables Showing the Returns of Votes Cast Last Month.

Republicans Have Nearly 500,000 Plurality in the North—This is Offset by Pro-Union Plurality in Certain Southern States.

The official returns from all the states have been made and both for future reference and to show the significance of the vote THE ASTORIAN gives them in full. Because the democratic plurality of 37,690 comes from the southern states, the returns are given by sections. Following is the table of northern states:
