A Silo.

The silo should be built high, so as to give greater pressure within its walls. As for instance: One ten feet square at the base should not be less than twenty feet in altitude. For one of this size, heavy studding should be used, placed not further than ten inches apart. After boarding up on the outside, rustic or ship-lap may be used on the inside. Ceil closely on the inside. Now place the room throughout with tarred paper. Over this paper place another another ceiling of rustic or ship-lap, and the silo is ready for use. When filled, or so much grass or fodder is placed in it as desired, place tarred paper over the top and cover with earth to a depth of one foot or more. Be sure to put on sufficient dirt to exclude the air. The cost of building this silo, material and workmanship, need not exceed \$100.
