A storm comes and all we can do is to wait and count the dead that are cast on the shore when the waves are standing with them. The sea is a standing rebuke to our Aryan egotism, and until we conquer it our work will not be done.

The New States.

The revised statutes provided that a star shall be added to the flag on the 4th day of July succeeding the admission of a new state.
