AN ACCOMMODATING MURDERER. Consents to be Hanged Ahead of Time to Oblige a Newspaper Man.

"The Ledger's account of the enterprise of Wilbur F. Storey, late proprietor of the Chicago Times, contained in a recent issue," said a citizen yesterday, "reminds me of a story told me by a newspaper man, John Flannagan, who dropped dead at a funeral at Utica, N. Y., a little over a year ago:
"In the lumber district of northern

New York a lumberman named Searle had murdered his wife and had been sentenced to be hanged. Flannagan was detailed to write an account of the hanging for the Utica Herald. He was also correspondent for the Chicago Times, Boston Globe and New York Herald. He chartered an engine and one car to carry him from the main line of the New York Central to the terminus of a branch line, where he took a buggy and was conveyed to the village where the execution was to take place.

He was very much annoyed to learn that the hour for the hanging was I o'clock. He went to the prisoner, and after a few minutes's talk, said: "See here, Scarle, if you are not

executed till 1 o'clock it will upset all my work. I'll miss my special ear, as it has to be at another point on the main line at 1 o'clock, and I will not be able to get the account in any of the papers to-morrow that I represent. Now, as an accomodation to me, wouldn't you be willing to be executed at 11 o'clock?"

After a moment's reflection, Searle replied: "Well, it is tedious waiting, and if

it will be any accommodation to you Pll do it." The sheriff, who was much more nervous than the prisoner, after some persuasion was induced to expedite matters, and Searle was hanged at 11

Flanuagan reached his car just as it was about to start without him, and the readers of the various nals he represented were edified the next day with a full account of Searles' execution.—Tacoma Ledger


