BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA: A PROCLAMATION.

THE FOLLOWING PROVISION SOF THE laws of the United States are hereby published for the Information of all concerned:

Section 1956, Revised Statutes, chapter 3, title 23, enacts that "No person shall kill any otter, mink, marten, sable, or fur seal, or other fur bearing animal within the limits of Alaska Territory, or in the waters thereof; and every person gailty thereof shall, for each offense, be fined not less than two hundred nor more than one thousand dollars, or imprisoned not more than alt months, or both, and all vessels, their tackie, apparel, furniture, and cargo, found engaged in violation of this Section shall be furfelted, but the Secretary of the Treasury shall have power to authorize the killing of of any such mink, marten, sable, or other fur-bearing snimal, except fur seals, under such regulations a he may prescribe, and it shall be the duty of the Secretary to prevent the killing of any fur seal, and to provide for the execution of the provisions of this Section until it is otherwise provided by law, nor shall he grant any special privileges under this Section."

Section 3 of the get entitled "An act to provide for the protection of the salmon fisheries of Alaska," approved March 2, 1889, provides that:

"Section 3. That Section 1856 of the Revised Statutes of the United States is hereby declared to include and apply to all the dominion of the United States in the waters of Sehring Sea, and it shall be the duty of the President at a timely season in each year, to issue his proclamation, and cause the same to be published for one month at least in one newspaper (if, any such there be) published at each United States port of entry on the Pacific coast, warning all persons against entering such waters for the purpose of violating the provisions of said section, and he shall also cause one or more vessels of the United States to diligently cruise said waters and arrest all persons and selze all vessels found to be or to have been engaged in any violation of the laws of the United States, hereby warn all persons against entering the waters of Behring Sea, within the dominion of the United States, for the purpose of violating the provisions of said section 1966, Revised Statutes; and I hereby procelaim, that all persons found to be, or to have been engaged in any violation of the laws of the United States, in said waters, will be arrested and punished as above provided, and that all vessels so employed, their tackle, apparel, furniture and cargoes will be selzed and forfeited.


