BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA: A PROCLAMATION, THE POLLOWING PROVISIONS OF THE laws of the United States are hereby published for the information of all cur-

published for the information of all concerned:

Section 1356, Revised Statutes, chapter 3, title 23, enacts that "No person shall kill any otter, mink, marten, sable, or fur seal, or other fur bearing animal within the limits of Alaska Territory, or in the waters thereof; and every person guilty thereof shall, for each offense, be fined not less than two hundred nor more than one thousand dollars, or imprisoned not more than six months, or both, and all vessels, their tackle, apparel, furniture, and cargo, found engaged in violation of this Section shall be forielted, but the Secretary of the Treasury shall have power to authorize the killing of of any such mink, marten, sable, or other fur-bearing animal, except fur seals, under such regulations a he may prescribe, and it shall be the duty of the Secretary to prevent the killing of any fur seal, and to provide for the execution of the provisions of this Section until it is otherwise provided by law, nor shall be grant any special privileges under this Section."

Section 3 of the act entitled "An act to provide for the protection of the salmon isheries of Alaska," approved March 2, 1889, provides that;

"Section 3. That Section 1936 of the Revised Statutes of the United States is hereby declared to include and apply to all the dominion of the United States in the waters of Behring Sea, and it shall be the duty of the President at a timely season in each year, to issue his proclamation, and cause the same to be published for one month at least in one newspaper (if any such there be) published at each United States port of entry on the Pacific coast, warning all persons against entering such waters for the purpose of violating the provisions of said section, and he shalf also cause one or more vessels of the United States to diligently cruise said waters and arrest all persons and selze all vessels found to be or to have been engaged in any violation of the laws of the United States, hereoy warn all persons against entering the waters of Behring Sea, within the dominion of the United States, for the purpose of violating the provisions of said section 1956, Revised Statutes; and I hereby proclaim, that all persons found to be, or to have been engaged in any violation of the laws of the United States, in said waters, will be arrested and junished as above provided, and that all vessels so employed, their tackie, apparel, furniture and cargoes will be selzed and forfeited.

#### Genuine Baked Beans.

Wash a quart of small white beans and put them into a kettle of cold water; the water should cover the beans. Put in a heaping teaspoon-ful of salt to keep the beans from "mushing." Bring the water some-what slowly to a boil, but do not boil them over five minutes. Then pour the water off and put the beans into an earthen or iron pot. Put in half or three-quarters of a pound of fresh fat pork—no lean; salt fat pork, if there is no suspicion of taint, is just as good. If fresh fat pork is used salt must be added to the taste. Fill the pot with water to the top of the beans and pork, and add, if fan-cied, a half teaspoonful each of soda and mustard, and a teaspoonful of molasses. Bake slowly from six to twelve hours; a brick oven is preferred. Beans are an economical dish. They contain all the proper-ties necessary to nourish brain, bone and sinew. They lack carbon, how-ever, and this the pork gives. In order to have pork and beans fit for the gods, the beans should be completely saturated with the rich fat of the pork and not soaked with water. Don't par-boil beans nearly to a mush and then bake but an hour or two and don't use bacon or ham.

An ordinance for the protection of public sewers, and to provide for the manner of making connections therewith and to compel all persons creeting or maintaining privies or cesspools within one hundred feet in which a sewer has been or may be hereafter constructed to onnect the same therewith.

The City of Astoria does ordain as

Section I. No person or persons shall within the corporate limits of the City of Astoria, erect or maintain or suffer to be erected or maintained upon any premises owned by him, her or them any privy or cesspool within one hundred feet in that portion of the town, now City of Astoria as laid out and recorded by John McClure as extended by Cryps Olipey and one hundred and fitty Cyrus Olney and one hundred and flits feet in the town, now City of Astoria as laid out and recorded by J. M. Shiv-ly, of any street in which a sewer has ly, of any street in which a sewer has been or may hereafter be constructed, without causing such privy or cesspool to be connected with such sewer in the manner provided by this ordinance.

Sec. 2. All persons erecting or maintaining any privy or cesspool within the corporate limits of the City of Astoria, who have made the connections required in section one of this ordinance shall keep the said connections free and shall keep the said connections free and clean of and from all obstructions and in good order and condition so as to

properly drain any such privy or cess pool. Sec. 3. It shall be unlawful for any Sec. 3. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to make connections with or in any manner obstruct or interfere with any public sewer or drain pipe, except as hereinafter provided.

Sec. 4. Any person or persons desiring to make connections with any public sewer or drain pipe shall make written application for a permit therefor, specifying therein the location, area to be drained, and whether for house drainage or otherwise.

drainage or otherwise.
See, 5. The officers constituting the street department are hereby authorized street department are hereby authorized to grant permits for such connections, subject to such restrictions as to size of pipes, traps, and the manner of doing the work as they may deem necessary and proper; Provided, that no connection shall be made [except within the line of the jot or block,] with other than terra cotta pipe or some other material not subject to injury from the use of acids or other deleterious substances. And further provided: that the parties making such connections shall cause that portion of the street disturbed to

be placed in good condition.
Sec. 6. Security by deposit or otherwise may be required of such applicant against loss or damage resulting from carelessness, improper work or material, or failure to comply with the terms of the permit.

al. or failure to comply with the terms of the permit.

Sec. 7. A violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed a misdemeanor, and upon conviction before the Police Judge, the offender or offenders shall be punished by a fine of not less than five nor more than one hundred dollars, or by imprisonment in the city jail not less than three nor more than twenty days.


