

The following notice has recently been issued: The lighthouse board regrets to state that the appropria-tion for salaries of keepers of light-

houses is insufficient to pay salaries for the entire year upon the basis now allowed. This deficiency was anticipated and reported to congress, but Central Restaurant. no money was appropriated to meet As it is absolutely forbidden by law to exceed the amount appropriated during any year, it will, therefore, be

necessary to make a deduction from the salary of each keeper in the ser-vice sufficient to bring the total payment within the amount now set aside in the freasury for the purpose. It is found that such deduction must be about 4 per cent. of the annual salary of each keeper. That amount will, therefore, be deducted from the salary of each keeper

now in the service. A careful account will be kept of each deduction, and every effort will be made to have an appropriation made by congress to re-fund it. The salaries will be restored to the regular rates on and after July 1 next.
