FELL FROM ALOFT.

A Sailor Kills a Shipmate and is Crippled for Life.

"Do you see that man just getting into that car?" asked Dr. Kalloch, passed assistant surgeon of the United States marine service, to an *Alta* reporter yesterday. The person designated was a young man probably twenty-five years of age, though physical suffering made him appear much older. He was a cripple, afflicted with some spinal ailment, judging from his walk. "Well," continued the surgeon, "there is a most remarkable story connected with that man's injury." Dr. Kalloch then told the following story: The man's name is James Connor. When quite young he left his home in England and followed the sea as a sailor. About six years ago he was on the ship *Rainbow*, which was then at anchor in one of the ports on the Brazilian coast. Connor was sent aloft to furl a sail. The sail, which was flapping in the wind, knocked him from the yard, and down he shot from the dizzy height like a cannon ball toward the deck below. On the deck standing by the rail, was a sailor named Raymond, who was watching a shark by the vessel's side. Instead of falling to the deck, Connor struck his shipmate on the top of the head, breaking Raymond's neck, death resulting instantly.

Connor was picked up unconscious. It was supposed he was killed, but half an hour after he recovered his senses and was sent ashore to the hospital. His spine was injured, and he was pretty generally bruised. For three months he lay in the hospital in plaster of Paris casts, and even for a long time after he left he wore one of the casts on his back.

Connor, however, continued to go to sea, doing steward's duties. He is now a steward on a Pacific coasting vessel. He has often expressed a wish to return to England, but has not gone, as he does not wish to present himself before his relatives in his crippled condition.—S. F. *Alta*.

A Ferocious Beast.

Geo. M. Clark, of the foot hills, came to the city Thursday with a cougar and a wild cat scalp. The \$5 received for the cougar was only a small recompense for the \$63 damage done. One evening the cougar appeared on Mr. Clark's place and was killing a sheep when attacked by Mr. Clark's faithful shepherd dog, for which he had been offered \$25, and which had a record of assisting in killing six bears, thirteen coyotes and several cougars and wild cats. The cougar turned, killed the dog, and soon broke the neck of a nineteen sheep, worth \$2 a head. Two days afterwards Mr. Clark and his brother succeeded in trapping him and bringing him down. He had eight bullets in him when scalped, and was 3 feet 2 inches long. The Clark boys are death on cougars; but they never killed one with more satisfaction than they did this big fellow.—*Albany Democrat*.
