The Value of Money.

The value of money in this country during its early days is probably well remembered by the old settlers, but their reminiscences would need the support of official record to be believed by some of those who dispose of their dollars as though the only object was to lighten their pockets of the metal burden. From one of the old documents of court recorded on file in the county clerk's office, the copy of the following note is extracted:
"Within sixty days, without grace, after date I promise to pay to the order of John Curry the sum of \$2,500 with interest thereon from date until paid, at the rate of 4 per cent. per month, the interest payable monthly in advance, and if not so paid to become a part of the principal and bear thereafter the same rate of interest, compounding monthly, for value received. T. A. MUDGE."
This note was given in 1856. In 1861 the note had not been paid, and Curry received judgment in the sum of \$21,436.—*Santa Rosa Democrat.*
