Unjust Assessment.

An exchange thus pointedly illustrates some of the inequalities and absurdities of the present system of taxation: "A few years ago a Chicago capitalist bought the odd numbered sections of a tract of land ranging from Farmington to Spangle, in Whitman and Spokane counties, for which he paid \$2.60 an acre. Since that time the land has been assessed as "uncultivated," and valued at the purchase price. In the meantime the even numbered sections, owned and occupied by actual settlers, have been improved, which has changed the country from a wilderness to a prosperous farming district. The speculators' land is now thrown upon the market at an enormous price, and there are plenty of buyers. That was a good investment, and the Chicago man is happy and is more than convinced that wild land is the thing to invest in. But how has the actual settler, whose farm joined the speculator's land, fared during this time? He will tell you that every dollar and every day's work invested in improvements he has paid taxes on. He had a cow when he started. The cow was taxed. The cow had a calf. The calf was taxed. He had to have a team, plow and wagon. They were taxed. He had to have a house to live in. That was taxed. He had to have a fence to protect his crops. That was taxed. He had to live there to tend to his improvements. He was taxed \$2 a year. At every turn he was taxed for adding to the general wealth of the community, and enhancing the value of the speculator's possessions. But he found consolation in the fact that by his own manly efforts he had made his home worth more than the same number of acres of the speculator's land, and the assessor's books would prove it.

Worth Remembering.

We are often placed in positions requiring assistance, and perhaps thrown upon our own resources, the following may be impressed upon the memory to advantage:

If scalded, plunge the part in water. This relieves pain instantly, and gives time for thought and composure.

An insect in the ear may be drowned out with tepid water or killed by a few drops of sweet oil.

If anything hard gets into the ear, double a stout horse-hair, place the head on one side and drop the loop into the ear, move it about until it catches the object, and then draw it out.

In cases of poisonous bite such the wound instantly, unless the month is sore.

If the throat burns after swallowing a poison drink sweet oil. If you are falling asleep from a poison drink half a glass of water into which has been stirred a teaspoonful each of salt and common table mustard, and, after vomiting, drink the strongest coffee and keep in motion until perfectly awake. After any poison swallow one or two raw eggs.

If smoke is suffocating you fall on the floor and crawl out on your hands and knees.

In cases of insensibility, in which there is loud snoring, the person is seized with apoplexy. Raise the head, remove pressure from the neck. If the face is pale and the breathing very low, it is a case of fainting. Place the body perfectly level and lower the head. The patient will promptly revive. Nothing else is necessary.
