Manner in which Public Lands May Be Disposed of.

1. At public sale to the highest bidder, or after publication of the commissioner of the general land office. (Sections 2,353 and 2,445, U. S. Revised Statutes.)

2. By pre-emption under sections 2,257 to 2,298, U. S. Revised Statutes, with nominal fee and commissions, or when commuted to cash entry, then the minimum price as aforesaid.

3. By location of agricultural college scrip [set of July 2, 1862], same as military bounty land warrants next above.

4. By location of private land claim scrip same as next above.

5. By locations of Sioux half-breed scrip, on lands held at \$1.25 or \$1.50, minimum price, as the case may be, under section 2,357, Revised Statutes.

6. By locations of various classes of scrip, issued to individuals under special acts of congress locatable some of it, upon lands held at \$1.25 per acre, minimum, some, upon either \$1.25 per acre or \$2.50 per acre, minimum; such as Porterfield scrip, Valentine scrip, Cole's scrip, Chippewa scrip, and Revolutionary bounty land scrip, the latter receivable as money at \$1.25 for each acre called for therein.

7. Mineral entries, lode claims and placer claims, the former at \$5, the latter at \$2.50 per acre, minimum, as the case may be, under section 2,357, U. S. Revised Statutes.

8. Certain lands, containing salt springs, formerly reserved by acts of congress, may now be sold at public auction, or after offering at such sale, if then unsold, by private entry, at the minimum price of \$1.25 per acre, under act of January 12, 1877.

9. Coal lands are sold under sections 2,347 to 2,352, U. S. Revised Statutes, at the minimum of \$10 per acre, if situated more than 15 miles from any completed railroad, and \$20 per acre if situated within 15 miles of such road.

10. Selections under congressional grants of swamp lands by acts of March 2, 1849, September 28, 1850, and March 12, 1860; of indemnity for swamp lands, under act of March 2, 1865, and March 3, 1867; of school indemnity under sections 2,275 and 2,276, U. S. Revised Statutes, and various other enactments; and grants for universities, by various acts of congress, and under the various railroad grants.
