Here is a chance for the anarchists. The Columbian government offers to pay the passage of an emigrant, give him \$6 a month, 250 acres of land, a cow, two pigs, a plow, help him to build a house and transport him free from the seaport to the point where he desires to settle. The president has decided that the civil service rules which prohibit reinstatement without a regular examination of parties who have been out of the classified service of the government for more than a year, shall not apply to veterans of the Union army. This will enable about 1,000 veterans discharged during the first three years of Cleveland's administration to get their places back.

The bamboo tree does not blossom until it attains its thirtieth year, when it produces seed profusely and then dies. It is said that a famine was prevented in India in 1812 by the sudden flowering of the bamboo trees, where 50,000 people had resorted to the jungles to gather the seed for food.
