JOYS OF CAMP LIFE.

All Modern Inconveniences, but No End of Fun.

Did you ever go out camping? That's the real way to take solid comfort during a vacation. Avoid counting hotels and farmhouses. The true path to enjoyment is to get a party of three or four, hire a tent, load yourselves like packmules with bedding, frying pans and a shotgun and go somewhere. The further you get away from home the better you will enjoy yourself.

You have taken your gun along, and some day you succeed in shooting a couple of chipmunks and a sparrow, perhaps. With average camping luck there will be a smart shower every day, clearing off soon enough for your traps to dry before the next one comes along to wet them again.

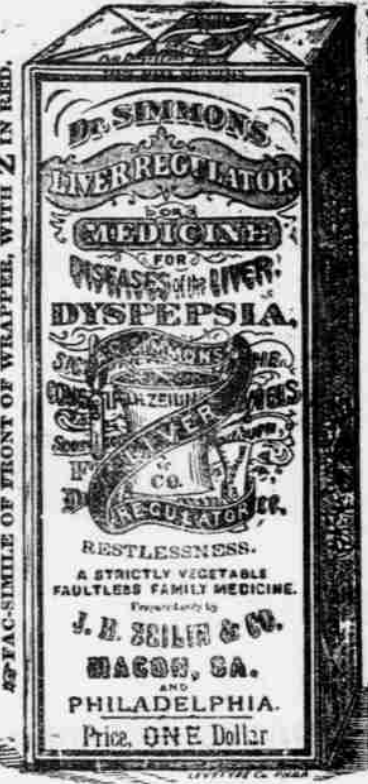
