TIMBER LAND ENTRIES.

A Decision That is a Hardship to Many Purchasers.

A recent ruling by the commissioner of the general land office at Washington, D. C., is causing a great deal of trouble on this coast to many parties who have acquired title to government timber land during the past two years. The law, it seems, requires that in purchases of timber land final proof must be made within ninety days of the time of entry. Under the press of business at the Seattle land office this requirement has been disregarded. The date of final proof has been set for five or six months, and in many cases more than a year ahead of the time of making entry. This, it must be understood, was through no fault of the intending purchasers. The officials of the Seattle office set the time for making final proof, and the purchasers fulfilled every requirement of the law so far as they were able to do so.

Under the new ruling all timber land entries made at the Seattle office in the past two or three years are null and void. Purchasers who had, as they supposed, successfully made final proof and had paid to the government the purchase price of their claim, find their entries thrown out, and have the money which was accepted by the government returned to them, with polite note stating why the elusive timber land has slipped from their grasp.

Though this ruling is in strict accord with the letter of the law, it will undoubtedly work a hardship in many cases. It will also have the effect of discouraging the acquisition of timber land by purchase from the government, and will throw a cloud upon many titles to timber land which have heretofore been deemed perfect.

An Eminent, Aged Jurist.

Ex-justice William Strong, late of the supreme court of the United States, arrived here overland from California Wednesday, with his two daughters. He is in his 83d year, and is a hale, fine looking man for that age.
