Cregonian Dispatch. SPOKANE FALLS, Aug. 5.—The en-tire business portion of the city, cov-ering nearly forty blocks, was de stroyed by fire to night. Fire broke out at 6 P. M., in a frame block near the depot. The water pressure was very weak, and the flames spread rapidly, sweeping the entire block in less than half an hour. A high less than half an hour. A high wind sprang up soon after the fire started, filling the air with burning embers, and starting fires in several adjacent blocks.
