SPOKANE FALLS BURNED.

Nearly Forty Blocks Swept Away.

Every Grocery, Dry Goods and Provision Store Gone.

SPOKANE FALLS, Aug. 5.—The entire business portion of the city, covering nearly forty blocks, was destroyed by fire to-night. Fire broke out at 6 P. M. in a frame block near the depot. The water pressure was very weak, and the flames spread rapidly, sweeping the entire block in less than half an hour. A high wind sprang up soon after the fire started, filling the air with burning embers, and starting fires in several adjacent blocks.

The Pacific hotel was the first valuable building to succumb. Adjoining it was the Russ house, a large frame hotel, which burned like tinder.

The fire communicated to the Northern Pacific passenger and freight depots, burning them to the ground. The Northern Pacific railroad's loss is variously estimated. The loss, including the freight in the warehouse, is estimated at about \$1,000,000.

The wind increased in violence, and shifted in all directions, creating a whirlwind of flame. It was then evident that the city was doomed, and the people became panic-stricken. The firemen lost all control over the mad demon.

The mayor ordered buildings to be blown up with giant powder. About a dozen large buildings and other small ones were blown up.

Every business house in the city, including eight banks, all the hotels but one, all the magnificent structures except the Crescent block, and every newspaper in the city except the *Review* is burned out.

The burned district includes all that part of the city from the Northern Pacific railway to the river, and from Lincoln to Washington streets, embracing over thirty blocks.

The fire exhausted itself at the river for lack of material to burn. All the flour and lumber mills were saved.

It is impossible to estimate the loss at this hour, but it will run far into the millions.

Charles Davis, sleeping in the Arlington, was awakened by the flames bursting through the window. He leaped from a third story window and was shockingly mangled and terribly burned, and is now reported dead.

A woman leaped from the second story window of the Pacific hotel, and is believed to be fatally injured.

A man jumped from the second story of Opera house block, and several bones were broken.

An unknown man was shot by exploding cartridges, and is supposed to be dead.

All the provisions and supplies in this city were burned, and necessarily there will be much suffering for a few days, until supplies are shipped in.

While it is a terrible blow to thousands of people, the city will be rebuilt as speedily as men and money can do it.

The U. S. Fish Commissioner.

Col. Marshall McDonald, the United States fish commissioner, is in Portland to-day. His visit to this coast is for the purpose of making arrangements for the development and extension of fish culture. His intention is to place the salmon fisheries of the coast under the same condition as the shad fisheries of the east; that is to restore and keep the supply up to its original standard, by means of artificial propagation. When asked by an *Oregonian* reporter if this would be practicable in the Columbia river, Colonel McDonald said:

"I think it can be done, but I cannot say for certain. This year the pack in the Columbia is only about a third of what it used to be. The commission began restocking the waters with shad in 1880, and in 1888 the catch was nearly double, and the increase in the value of the shad taken was nearly \$750,000. It may not be possible to obtain such good results with salmon as with shad, and whitefish, but there seems to be no reason why it should not be done, as the methods now in use for hatching and distributing fish are about as certain of securing the results desired as those used in sowing and raising wheat."

In order to render artificial propagation a success, some plan for regulating fishing will have to be devised so that an adequate number of fish to supply eggs for hatching can be secured. This will be difficult on the Columbia on account of its being between two states, and Colonel McDonald says the United States ought to take control of interstate fisheries, but this would be a difficult thing to do now.
