Portland Wants a Good Fire Boat.

News Specials From Portland and Elsewhere.

PORTLAND, Aug. 6.—The people of Portland have so far subscribed \$5,000 for Spokane snufflers. C. H. Dodd has gone to Spokane. His firm loses \$80,000.

Mayor DeLashmatt has received no word from Mayor Furth, of Spokane. Dr. T. C. Jessop tells a very sensational, not to say fishy story.

Last Sunday he heard some men talking about the recent fire in Seattle and Ellensburg, that Spokane would be the next place. All this the doctor learned while fishing for catfish on one of the lower wharves.

At a meeting of the business men held yesterday, Mayor DeLashmatt said in relation to the great necessity of having a fire boat. "Gentlemen, when the matter of consolidating these two cities came up, one of the reasons why I worked for the measure was that we could have a first class fire boat, which would accommodate the entire vicinity. I am in favor of a fire boat, but the mayor cannot build it alone. The board of trade should take the matter up, and at once. We have no use for such an old machine as we had before. The kind of boat we want, will cost perhaps \$40,000, but that is a mere bagatelle to the losses which we are likely at any time to sustain in consequence of the lack of it.

THE NEW OPERA HOUSE.

The excavating work on the site of the Marquam's opera house on Morrison, between Sixth and Seventh streets, is finished and the stone foundation walls are already up.

John Miller, who was shot in the eye last Sunday morning while fooling about a bar room, is getting along well at the Portland hospital. He will recover, but minus one eye, perhaps.

THINKS HE IS INNOCENT.

This morning A. Rosenthal, a Chinese scholar, now in this city, visited Che Gong in the county jail to speak to him in his native tongue. After the conclusion of the interview Mr. Rosenthal remarked: "I am perfectly convinced of the man's innocence. If he is guilty he is the greatest actor I ever saw. I am fairly familiar with the inner life of the Chinese of his class, and nothing can change my mind. I know some of the witnesses who testified against him; they have a very bad reputation among San Francisco Chinese."

"Are you going to do anything in his behalf?" "Yes, I am going to see the governor and tell him what I believe to be the correct status of the case, and see if there is not a possibility of saving Chee Gong's life."

And with that Mr. Rosenthal jumped on the Morrison street car on his mission to the governor.

RIGHT TO SEARCH FOR SMUGGLED GOODS.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 6.—Solicitor of the treasury Hepburn has given an opinion that when the collector of customs for Alaska has well-grounded opinions that liquor has been smuggled and concealed, he has authority to enter and search any building, provided it is not a storehouse or dwelling; if one of the latter, he must have a warrant. If he finds such smuggled goods he can seize them. He must, however, have well-grounded suspicion. The treasury department has approved the opinion and forwarded a copy of it to the collector.

SMALL-POX AND RAGS.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 6.—The state department has been warned by consul-general Cardwell at Cairo that the extensive trade in Egyptian rags with the United States is rendered particularly dangerous by the prevalence of small-pox in lower Egypt.

THE AMERICAN STATES CONVENTION.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 6.—The state department has been informed that the governments of Columbia and Venezuela will take part in the convention of American states to be held in October. All governments invited to participate have accepted, with the exception of Paraguay, Hayti and San Domingo.

THE THREE DESERTED SAILORS.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 6.—Admiral Gherardi has ordered the navy department that he will send either the *Osipe* or the *Kearys* to the rescue of the three starving American sailors on Arenaskey Island, Yucatan.

The Salmon Run on the Fraser.

Reports from all the canneries say that fish are just what they ought to be—as plentiful as the water itself, so to speak. On one of the cannery wharves yesterday afternoon, 16,000 salmon lay in one shining heap, and those who saw the pile say it was a wonderful sight to behold. Another wharf held a round 10,000 fish, and many others held as many or more. The packing capacity of the canneries was taxed to its utmost last night, and the past 24 hours has added many thousand cases to this season's pack. The outlook for the season is now bright, and the indications are that the Fraser river pack this year will be the largest on record.—*Columbian*.
