THE ARIZONA "KICKER."

Trial and Tribulations of a Western Editor.

On Tuesday last we were seized with an attack of Apache colic, and within ten minutes from the time the grip first took hold we were tied in seven kinds of hard knots, and wanted a "mule" team to hold us. It should be explained that this colic is next door to Asiatic cholera, and when it takes hold it means business at wholesale rates.



Shively, from 100 feet east of the east side of West street to the western end of Arch street, by grading and filling said street to its established grade, and by planing the same to a width of sixteen feet through the center thereof with new and sound fir planks three inches thick and six inches wide, said planks to be laid one inch apart, and by building sidewalks six feet wide on both sides of said street, and unless a remonstrance signed by the owners of two-thirds of the property fronting on said portion of said street be filed with the Auditor and Police Judge within ten days of the final publication of this notice, to wit: on or before Monday August 19th, 1889, the Common Council will order said improvement to be made, said improvement to be made at the expense of the adjacent property.
